Enrolments for 2025

Our School has started to take enrolments for 2025. I would encourage all families that have a child that will be starting Preschool next year to come in and enrol your child now. Our staff will be happy to let you know about our programs and hours of operation. The school will be holding a welcome to preschool information session for all families in Term 4. Please pass this information on to all families that you think may be interested in joining our Preschool.

The school is also taking enrolments for all other years, **Transition – Year 6**.

Each classroom in our school has been designed to maximise students' opportunities to work in creative and collaborative spaces. Technology is integrated across all learning areas and is used to extend and enhance the learning. Some of our programs include:

One to One Laptop Program all students from year 4 will be issued with their own laptop to support learning across all areas and to embrace 21st Century learning skills.

Meaningful Maths a hands-on approach to the teaching and learning of maths.

Read Write Inc. provides a structured and systematic approach to teaching literacy.

'Be You' a wellbeing program that uses an evidence-informed framework that equips school educators to support the wellbeing of children.

Bounce Back a social emotional learning program that promotes wellbeing and resilience.

Aboriginal Culture and Language Program a social emotional learning program that promotes wellbeing and resilience.

Digital Literacy and Robotics Program with a strong focus on problem solving, enquiry learning, science, technology, engineering and maths.

Kitchen Garden Program inspiring students to make the most of their outdoor spaces and promoting a lifelong connection with the natural environment. It fosters student learning, health and wellbeing.

Aboriginal Language and Culture Program, this program supports Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal students to develop a strong sense of identity, pride and self-esteem that strengthens wellbeing and engagement.

AFL NT Future Leaders Program, teaching the qualities of leadership, goal setting and working as a team.

Circus Curriculum, teaching our students to persist and be brave in a fun hands-on learning environment.

Indonesian Language and Culture Program, taught from Transition to Year 6 in partnership with the Darwin language Centre.

Physical Education, Science, History and Geography is taught using an enquiry approach by a specialist teacher.

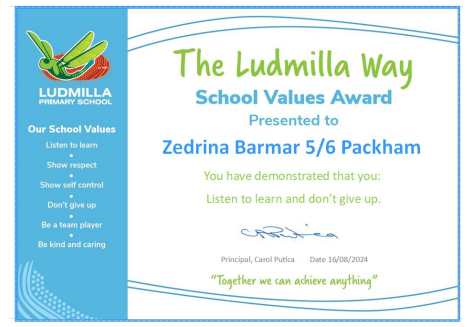




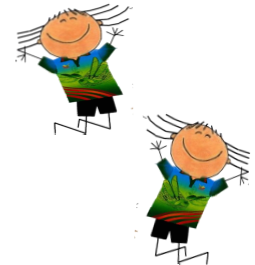

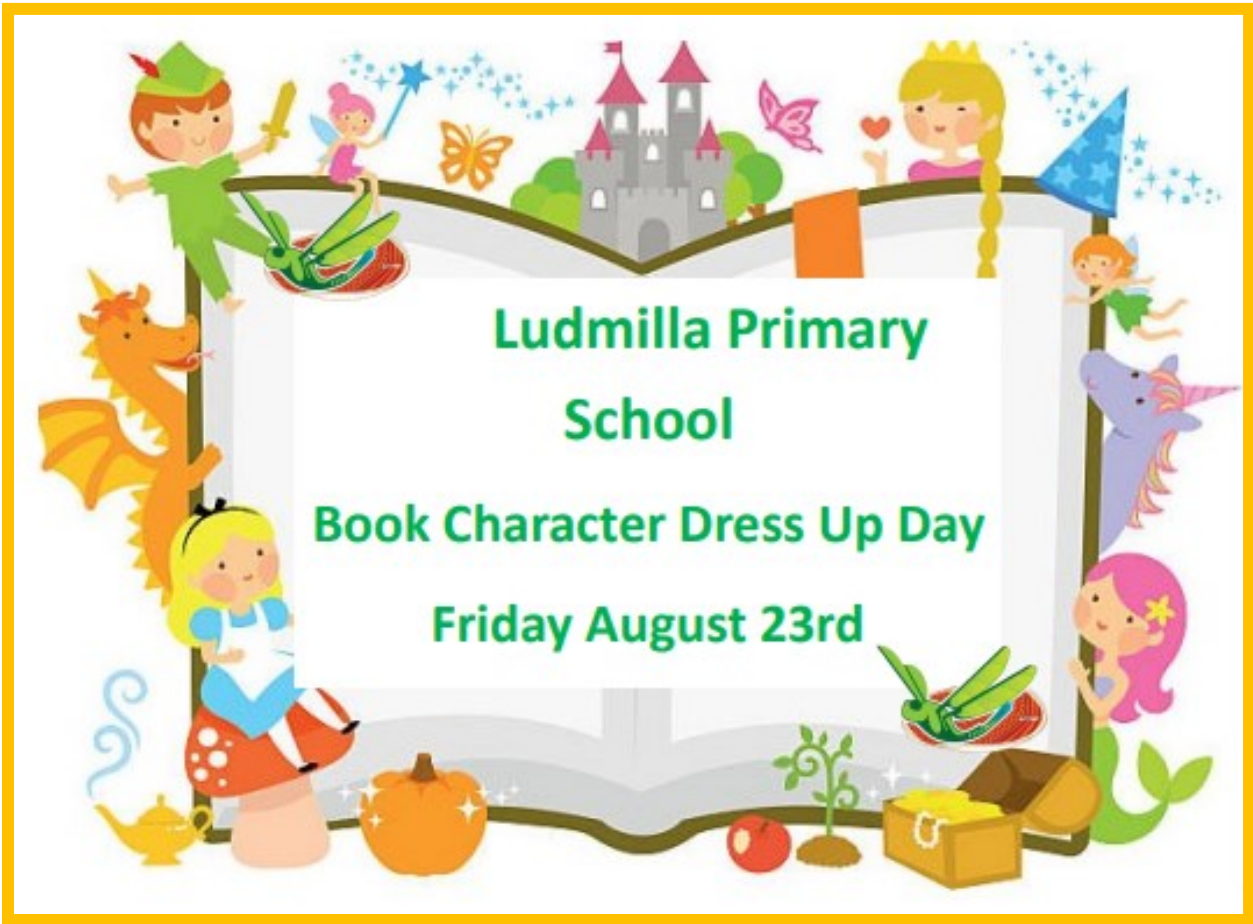
